It is time to leap out of hibernation and clearly, some of you have leapt early to attend the first couple of tournaments of the season. Just like spring, Skat, our beloved game, is rebounding. More and more are we hearing new names surfacing into the North American ISPA Skat circus. While the names are new to us, these new folk seem to mostly come preloaded with Skat skills, which is leading to pleasant surprises during the tournaments, how refreshing to see is that!

Goes to show that not all is lost in the Skat clubs, and the constant advertising and coaching of new players in our clubs is paying off. That is clearly the way to go to keep the excitement of the ultimate card game going, that comes by executing the game to perfection, but also by traveling and meeting new characters on the scene.

The original plan for Poland to host the 23rd edition of the WM unfortunately fell through, and so the

opportunity was created to enjoy the warmth of the Mediterranean in October once again. Even if you did not go to the European Championship in 2019, rest assured that the experience playing Skat on a cruise ship is worth it. This year, no less than nine harbour excursions are on the plan, and that is not including the start and end location of the cruise in Savona, Italy. Three additional harbours are being included in the trip, those are Cadiz, Fuerteventura and Las Palmas in addition to another location that we did not visit in 2019: Barcelona. So even if you did experience the cruise in 2019, there are a lot of new things to see and enjoy. Besides, why would you not want to participate in the World Championship?

Other highlights naturally are:

- ♣ The US Open, the 10th edition of the highlight of the US calendar takes place in Boston, Massachusetts this year.
- ♣ The 39th Canadian Championship was again being held in Montréal, Quebec. This comes as a welcome surprise, as Horst originally had indicated that he and Jutta wanted to retire from hosting the CC, but a strong attendance in 2023 and convincing by the other clubs changed those plans for the time being.

The true Skat enthusiast however finds every tournament special, as all tournaments are an opportunity to continue to sharpen one's Skat skills and more importantly to reconnect with old and new friends. Here is to hope seeing many of you this Skat season, no matter where the battleground is located.

Tournament Results

At the time of writing this spring edition of the newsletter, only two tournaments had been played on the calendar and to keep with tradition, Las Vegas was the first event.

Las Vegas Tournament

While the tradition of position #1 of the calendar for the Las Vegas tournament continued, the traditional venue of the Hotel California did not. It appears that we as a Skat group did not leave enough money there, which is why the price for the room rental at the California had been raised to the point where this location was no longer feasible. The US Skat Executive therefore got busy finding a new location and the German American Social Club of Nevada stepped up to hosting the tournament. The tournament continues to be called Las Vegas tournament, that is because the German American Social Club of Nevada resides within the Las Vegas city boundaries.

The tournament attracted 54 players from Germany, Canada, the United States as well as one player from Australia! Wolfgang Stillger won the prize for the greatest travel distance.

Germany's Detlef Schwarzer and Sven-Oliver Krack controlled the tournament early on throughout the first two series respectively, but then Canada's Danny Ridder took over the lead after round three. In round four, Brendan Hunt moved himself up into the lead, which he did not relinquish anymore, winning the tournament with 6326 points. Sven-Oliver Krack came in second place with 5960 points, followed by Danny Ridder in third (5781).



Worth mentioning is Eve Dankemeyer's monstrous comeback after only 1778 points in the first three rounds to win best lady with a total of 5198 points out of the five rounds played.

The five series winners were Detlef Schwarzer (Germany), Baldur Hirschberger (Canada), Danny Ridder (Canada), Eric Schuler (Canada), and Eve Dankemeyer (USA).



In the team competition, the pure German team called the SODAS won with 21542 points.

39th Canadian Championship Montréal

The 39th Canadian Skat Championship was held at the Brasserie Residence in Pierrefonds after the annual general meeting of ISPA Canada. 66 players made it to Quebec. With the growing number of players interested in also playing the pre-tournament, Horst and Jutta decided to do that also at the Brasserie. Over 50 people played this sponsored event, a big thanks to Horst and Jutta for their repeated generosity, paying for everyone's tab, which not only included the drinks but also the food!

The lunch on Saturday during the main tournament was also sponsored, Carsten Schmid fed the crowds with a delicious catered buffet lunch. A big thank you to Carsten as well for his generosity!

In line with tradition, the game competition ran over six rounds, split into three times two rounds. The year 2024 was the year of Scott McCormick, winning the title of Canadian Champion 2024, narrowly outperforming Steve Muehling by 83 points, with a total of 7307 points. In third place came Jutta, the tournament organizer with 7147, and therefore also winning the title Female Canadian Champion 2024 and best lady.





Six different players made up the series winners this year: Frank Heuvelmans, Gerd Reiner, Ewald Apel, Wolfgang Stillger, Amelie Leibl, and Roger Beckerman. It should be noted here that the player to travel the furthest to Montréal was the Tasmanian Wolfgang Stillger. With this island south of Australia being pretty much on the other side of the world, it appears that Wolfgang handles jet lag pretty good!

Various Club Fees were discussed. Annual Club fees will remain at \$10 per individual. The Club will pay the ISPA fees for those who have played 30 games or more during the year. The Club will facilitate the collection and payment of ISPA fees for those who do not qualify but wish to be ISPA members. German Canadian Concordia Club of Saskatoon (GCCC) fees of \$10 per person will be paid for by the Club for all qualifying members as well. We need to keep our membership up in the GCCC due to the sponsorship/grants they provide. Club Membership of \$50 to the SK German Council was also approved for payment (also for the same reason – grants and sponsorships).

This coming year applications have gone into the GCCC, the SK German Council and the City of Saskatoon for grants. If approved these grants total more than \$2500.00 for the club.

The adoption of the new computer program has been a success, especially for tournaments.

Dates for tournaments were decided upon and posted on the ISPA website.

Annual SKAT awards were presented. Best overall in 2023 with 49 games and an average of 1023 was Siegfried Fahr. 2nd Mark Young and 3rd Rudi Laprell. The best attendance with 50 Wednesday nights of play was Ed Eckl.

The Saskatoon SKAT Club has been active in remaining visible in the community by participating in events such as the Saskatoon 3-day Folkfest, and the Christkindl Markt. This June our provincial SK German Council has asked us to put on a workshop at their annual Treffpunkt. This along with attending various Tournaments in 2024 will Keep us Busy!

On three occasions we had guest player participation, mostly from Edmonton. Instead of charging a membership fee, we take two dollars from the five-dollar entry fee per Monday night game to cover the annual ISPA membership fees as well as to cover food and prizes for the year-end windup.
